E. Discussion – Academic Innovation (A.I.) with Dr. David Reinhart, Philosophy & Religious Studies Dept.

David Reinhart shared about the Jan. 20, 2017 UWW Academic Innovation Snowbox: A Space for Collaboration and Creativity. Teams wrote 22 proposals with ideas that would advance student learning, such as reduce students' time to degree, reduce equity gaps, reduce barriers to creative solutions, foster greater student learning, create new opportunities for students to engage with contemporary content and issues using high impact practices.

Feedback from CC members included:

- -Will there be support if students give poor faculty evaluations if new innovation is tried?
- -What is the timeframe? Five years? Gradual pilot?
- -Incentives?
- -How to do it? Do as a campus?

- -Concern about getting content taught, especially for students taking standardized test to get into medical school.
- How to incorporate, for example, a Skills focused course, .5 credit? 1.0 credit?
