Comments related to recommendation #1

The program created a vision statement complimentary to the program's description. The vision includes the expectation of developing new commercial enterprises, creating more jobs, and fostering economic growth.

It would be helpful to read in the vision statement how this program is set apart, and unique, from other general business programs. Such as focusing on the creative and innovative nature inherent in the program. Revise so as not to use "foster" twice. Short- and long-term goals: all of these make sense, and we look forward to reading more detail about how these goals were met (strategies that were implemented) in the next full self-study.

The short- and long-term strategies are good and some of them are in progress. It will be interesting to learn in the next full self-study, how they'll be ordered and managed. (e.g., it seems the assessment plan should run alongside the curriculum benchmark before curriculum redesign, etc.)

Recommendation #2

Identify a smaller number of SLOs to evaluate. Align the SLOs to the courses where they will be assessed and develop assessment measures to evaluate student learning or proficiency. Implement direct and indirect assessment in the program. Collect and analyze data on student performances and explain how the data informed program decisions.

Comments related to recommendation #2

- 1. It is clear a lot of work was completed to reduce the number SLOs and embed the current SLOs in the curriculum in a meaningful way. While not expected for this progress report, the review team was interested in what the program was learning from the quizzes. We were thinking as quizzes primarily as content evaluation, and not based much on students demonstrated behaviors and skills. If that is the case, is it possible to incorporate a signature courses assignment into the assessment plan? For example, a business model or something along those lines would be great here, and I suspect students are already doing this as part of their course of study(?).
- 2. What is the relationship between the end-of-program quiz in MGT487 and its pre-assessment counterpart in MGT201? This may good a good opportunity to have pre- and post- data on student growth.
- I'd like to have seen a little more information on how quizzes will be designed to measure the broader scope of the new SLOs and to guide curriculum development.
