



The Office of the Provost is pleased to announce the **2023-24 Teaching and Learning grants**. The program will award \$1,000 grants to faculty and instructional academic staff to support entrepreneurial projects that enhance teaching and learning in the following areas during the 2023-2024 academic year:

- Up to 25 grants supporting projects related to fostering **inclusivity and civil discourse**
- Up to 25 grants supporting projects related to the use of generative **artificial intelligence (AI)** as a tool for student learning

**Examples of inclusivity and civil discourse**

projects may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Redesigns of class content/readings to reflect and foster intellectual diversity
- Implementation of creative initiatives that support differentiated instructional needs
- Creation of inclusive syllabi, assignments, and class activities
- Course redesigns that include faculty and student co-creation of classroom culture
- Implementation of strategies that build a strong sense of belonging and foster student interaction

**Examples of artificial intelligence (AI) projects**

may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Create personalized/adaptive learning experiences for students related to AI
- Develop original lesson plans/class activities using AI
- Generate innovative forms of assessment
- Increase the quality of feedback on student work
- Cultivating student career-readiness skills related to using AI in the workplace

*NOTE: Individuals may only receive one Teaching and Learning Grant, regardless of topic.*

**Recipient Responsibilities:**

- 1) Full project plan that builds on the application abstract by December 1, 2023. The project plan should identify the project’s dissemination within the university (see below).
- 2) Share the project’s outcomes with the university. Examples include a conference presentation/poster session at the May 2024 UWW Celebrating Teaching and Learning conference, an activity/event to the university community (e.g., lead a collaborative workshop with the LEARN Center and/or Learning Technology Center), or an asynchronous resource that can be made available on-demand to instructors (e.g., a recorded video series).
- 3) There will be optional but encouraged planning meetings in November and March for grant recipients to gather and share their project plans and provide status updates.

**Timeline (2023-2024)**

September 22nd: Proposals due  
 October 13th: Grant applicants notified  
 December 1st: Full project plan due  
*First stipend (\$500) initiated after selection*

January-April: Complete project  
 May 15th: Project’s outcomes shared  
*Second stipend (\$500) issued by end of 9-month contract, contingent on completion*
