I. Purpose

To provide procedures for conducting preliminary investigations.

II. Policy

It is the policy of the UW-Whitewater Police Department that preliminary investigations will be properly conducted and documented.

III. Procedure

- A. The officer initially assigned to an incident will be responsible for conducting the preliminary investigation. These preliminary duties include, but are not limited to:
 - 1. Observe all conditions, events, overall impression, and remarks regarding the incident.
 - i. Document them in the report
 - Maintain and protect the crime scene to ensure that evidence is not lost or contaminated, and arrange for the collection of evidence;
 - i. The crime scene should be secured by one or more of the following; locking/securing the area, placing police tape and/or barricades up around the perimeter, or using personnel around the perimeter of the scene.
 - ii. A police officer should be placed in charge of the perimeter to check personnel into and out of the scene and to maintain scene integrity.
 - 3. Determine whether an offense has been committed and, if so, the exact nature and circumstances of the offense;
 - i. Determine the jurisdiction of the offense so proper law enforcement agencies can investigate.
 - 4. Locate, identify and obtain written statements from complaint(s), victim(s), witnesses(es), and if legally possible, from the suspect(s);
 - 5. Interview the complainant, witnesses, victim(s) and suspect(s)
 - 6. Provide relevant information concerning wanted persons or vehicles through the communications system;
 - i. Physical description of suspect(s) to include clothing
 - ii. Description of vehicle, if one is involved, to include License plate, Make/Model, color, etc.

- iii . Last known direction of travel of suspect and/or vehicle
- 7. When appropriate, arrest suspect(s) in accordance with state and local statute violations.
- 8. When necessary, contact a supervisor for guidance. There is always either a supervisor on-duty or one on-call 24/7 that can call in crime scene investigators or a detective.
- 9. When needed, request a crime scene investigator and/or a detective for assistance.
- 10. Report the incident completely and accurately within the records management reporting system and on the UWW Police Cover Sheet.
- B. Detectives may assist the patrol officer with the preliminary investigation or may be directed by their supervisor to assume the duties of the preliminary investigation.
