CREDIT FOR PRIOR LEARNING

Adult students at UW-Whitewater can request credit for courses based on their work and life experience. During the application process, you'll work with the program coordinator to determine eligibility and select courses to request credit for. Once accepted, you'll enroll in an online Credit for Prior Learning course, earning 1.5 credits per course request. In the course, you'll create a portfolio that demonstrates your relevant experience and how it aligns with course objectives. Upon completing the portfolio, you'll earn credit for the class, and an expert evaluator will review your submission to determine if sufficient learning has been demonstrated for credit.



HUNZIKER SCHOLARSHIP

The Dr. Ernella S. Hunziker Scholarship, established in honor of UW-Whitewater professor Dr. Ernella S. Hunziker, supports female students pursuing their first undergraduate degree. Full-time students (12+ credits) can receive up to \$3,000 per year, and half-time students (6-11.5 credits) can receive \$1,500 per year, payable over two semesters. The scholarship is applied directly to tuition.

Eligibility requirements include:

- Female students, at least 24 years old
- Financial need
- Completion of 45+ credits toward an undergraduate degree, with at least 12 credits at UW-Whitewater
- A minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA
