Grants Help Build Behavioral Health Provider Workforce

Partnership seeks to expand capacity to recruit and retain clinicians, invest in their supervision and support

With a goal of building the behavioral health provider workforce of the future, [The Center for Inclusive Transition, Education & Employment \(CITEE\)](#) has just begun the second year of the [Qualified Treatment Trainee \(QTT\) Grants Program](#). This program is a partnership with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, Division of Care and Treatment Services (DHS/DCTS) in response to a new provision in the 2019-2021 Wisconsin State Budget. This program's aim is to grow the mental health workforce by increasing and improving pre- and post-graduate placement and employment opportunities for counselors, social workers, and marriage/family therapists. Last year, CITEE was able to award grants to more than 20 statewide agencies providing mental health services in high-needs areas. This fall, CITEE is working to award nearly 100 grants of \$20,000 each, with even more to come. Four different types of grants are available to agencies, each with unique opportunities to support supervisors and trainees in professional development and continuous growth. Agencies from urban and rural areas, from Milwaukee to Superior have benefited from QTT grants.

As a part of the Expanding Agencies Grants, CITEE, the UW-Whitewater Department of Social Work, and content experts from DHS have created a virtual Community of Practice (CoP). This continuing education opportunity allows supervisors to collaboratively focus on the process of quality supervision as they work with the next generation of our mental health workforce. Participants of the first CoP cohort found the experience so valuable that they requested and formed an alumni cohort, allowing them to continue their collaboration beyond the limits of the first grant period.

Melanie Heindl, Clinical Services Supervisor at SaintA in Milwaukee reflected on the outcomes of being a 2021 and 2022 recipient of the Expanding Agency Award. "SaintA was fortunate to have participated in the UW-W QTT Grants Program and gained immensely. The training and Community of Practice led to more fully developed and formalized onboarding, training, and shadowing experiences," Heindl noted. "The CoP created a space for collaboration and exchange with external supervisors from a wide array of backgrounds and service areas."

CITEE is supported by [the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs](#) and the [Division of Student Affairs](#). It works to develop and implement high quality programs for businesses, institutions, partners and communities to increase and retain individuals with disabilities in the workforce and community involvement.

She was selected for her dedication to academics and the positive influence she has on the college classroom.



Carmen Rivers, ECCE Program Coordinator was also recognized for her work in the field. Rivers was part of a panel for the annual conference of the [National Association of Young Children](#), where she spoke on "The ECE Higher Education Landscape: Managing Current Realities and Preparing for the Future." Her work on creating the ECCE program and the pipeline to a bachelor's degree for early childhood professionals was an important topic in this year's lineup of conference sessions and to all those working in the field.
