

The University Honors Program is proud to announce two pathways for completing University Honors credentials. Beginning in Fall 2019, Honors students may choose between Pathway 1 or Pathway 2.

Two pathways will allow students greater freedom and flexibility in charting their Honors pathway. In addition, two pathways will encourage students to engage in diverse high-impact educational practices (HIPs) while allowing greater collaboration among the HIP units in Student Diversity, Engagement and Success (SDES).

Pathway 1: Earn 21 Honors Credits through Honors coursework and/or H-Option Projects.

Pathway 2: Meet the Honors residency requirement of a minimum of 9 Honors credits through Honors coursework and/or H-Options, then pick your own pathway to 21 by earning Honors Exchanges through the SDES programs listed in this brochure. (You may also complete additional Honors Courses and/or H-Option Projects in this pathway!)

(Students in good standing in the Honors Program may apply for Honors Exchanges to be retroactively credited.)

Students must maintain the minimum cumulative UWW GPA of 3.4 to remain in the Honors Program, regardless of pathway.

Travel Study Courses Cooperating SDES Unit:

Office of Global Experiences # Honors Credits: 3 Per Course

Details: Honors students who complete a travel study course may apply to have their course converted to Global-Honors Exchange Credits.



Semester Abroad

Cooperating SDES Unit: Office of Global Experiences # Honors Credits: 6 Per Semester

Details: Honors students who complete a semester abroad program may apply for Global-Honors Exchange Credits.



Community-Based Learning (CBL)

Cooperating SDES Unit: Community-Based Learning Program # Honors Credits: Dependent on the Course

Details: Honors students complete 15 hours of direct contact in a CBL course. Training/prep, project work, and reflection are additional requirements.



King/Chavez Scholars Program

Cooperating SDES Unit: King/Chavez Program # Honors Credits: 3 Per Year

Details: King/Chavez Scholars who join the Honors Program qualify for KC-Honors Exchange Credits.

McNair Scholars Program

Cooperating SDES Unit: McNair Program # Honors Credits: 6 Per Year

Details: McNair Scholars who join the Honors Program qualify for the McNair-Honors Exchange Credits.

Research Apprenticeship Program (RAP)

Cooperating SDES Unit: Undergrad Research Program

Honors Credits: 3 Per Year

Details: Honors student research apprentices are partnered with a faculty researcher in their chosen field and assist the faculty researcher with a research project.

Cooperating SDES Unit: Undergrad Research Program

Honors Credits: 2 Per Project

Details: Honors students work with a faculty mentor to propose and conduct their own research project. Conference presentations required.

Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship (SURF)

Cooperating SDES Unit: Undergrad Research Program # Honors Credits: 3 Per Year

Details: Honors students work with a faculty mentor to propose and conduct a research project throughout the summer and the following academic year. Conference presentations required.
