Career prospects for management majors are open-ended with the potential for leading business operations and personnel in a number of fields. National employment of management occupations is projected to grow 7 percent from 2018 to 2028, and the national median salary for management occupations was \$105,660 in 2019.

In Wisconsin, employment of general and occupational managers is expected to grow by about 10 percent from 2016 to 2026 with about 3,440 annual projected job openings.
