



2022-2023 Dependency Override Renewal Form

A student with a previously approved Dependency Override for the 2021-2022 aid year at UW-Whitewater and who does not meet the federal criteria for independent status on the 2022-2023 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) may submit this renewal application AND a statement documenting current status to determine if the extenuating circumstances established in the prior year still exist.

Requirements:

- You must have submitted the FAFSA for 2022-2023. This can be done online at www.fafsa.gov
- This completed form. Note that this form and any required documentation must be submitted no later than 30 days prior to the end of the enrollment period.
- Attach a typed personal statement, with your name, date, and signature, that:
 1. outlines the mitigating circumstances and why you should continue to be considered independent in 22-23,
 2. includes information as to your current living situation and how you are supporting yourself, and
 3. addresses if and how the circumstances used to determine your original independent status have changed.
