2026 Winterim Application Directions

Overview:

Winterim is a three-week session held between the Fall and Spring terms designed to help students keep on track for graduation. Financial Aid for Winterim is awarded separately from the Fall 2025 and Spring 2026 terms, and there are many differences between eligibility for aid during Winterim and the academic year. Federal grant and loan eligibility is <u>VERY</u> limited for Winterim and many students <u>will not</u> be eligible.

General Eligibility Requirements:

In order to be eligible for and awarded federal financial aid for Winterim, you must meet all of the following requirements:

- Have a completed and fully processed 2025-2026 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- Be enrolled in courses for the Winterim term and have submitted this 2026 Winterim Application.
- Be enrolled at least half-time for the Spring 2026 term. Students who are not enrolled at least half-time for Spring are not eligible for any Winterim financial aid. Half-time status is defined as:
 - Undergraduate Students: 6 credits
 - Graduate Students: 4.5 credits
- Be maintaining Satisfactory Academic Progress.

Students who graduate(d) in the Fall 2025 and Winterim 2026 terms are not eligible for Winterim financial aid.

Federal Pell Grant Eligibility Requirements:

In order to be eligible for and awarded a Federal Pell Grant, you must:

- Meet the general eligibility requirements defined above.
- Be an undergraduate student who received/will receive a Federal Pell Grant in Fall 2025 and Spring 2026 terms.
- Be enrolled in fewer than 12 credits in the Spring 2026 term (if you are enrolled in 12 or more credits for spring, you will not be
 eligible for additional Pell Grant for Winterim).

Federal Subsidized and Unsubsidized Direct Loan Eligibility Requirements:

In order to be eligible for and awarded a Federal Subsidized or Unsubsidized Direct Loan, you must:

- Meet the general eligibility requirements defined above.
- Be enrolled at least half-time for Spring 2026 (6 credits or more for undergraduates; 4.5 credits or more for graduate students).
- Not already been awarded the maximum loan amount for your grade level for the academic year. Maximum loan amounts are:

If your grade level will change after Fall term, please submit your application after Fall grades have been posted.

Additional Notes:

- If you do not meet the requirements as described above, you may want to consider the <u>Parent PLUS Loan</u>, <u>Private Loans</u>, or <u>Graduate PLUS Loan</u>. For directions on how to apply, please visit http://www.uww.edu/financialaid/types-of-aid/loans.
- Financial aid for Winterim will disburse along with Spring aid after Winterim has ended. The initial Spring disbursement is January 21, 2026. Note that Winterim aid will pay Spring charges first; Winterim aid will only apply to Winterim charges if you have more Spring aid than Spring charges.
- Your Spring semester refund might be delayed due to unpaid Winterim charges.

Students graduating in Fall or Winterim are ineligible for Winterim aid.
