c: Interim Chancellor Chenoweth, Interim Provost Fox, Associate Vice Chancellor Plessel, Deans, Department Chairs, Faculty Senate Chair, Program Coordinators, University Marketing and Communications

The working group reviewed the needs and specific GPA of each individual program - or the GPA that they will intend/need to have based on their program's needs. Based on the data, and the needs each program has stated in their responses - if a global minimum is to be set at all - it should be based on the minimum of the GPAs represented in the spreadsheet (not the mode) - that would result in a minimum GPA of 2.75 to meet the needs of all persons and programs involved.

Otherwise, programs would be forced to adopt a GPA that does not work for their needs.

The recommendation is to not have a graduate school minimum required GPA to earn a certificate and to let each individual program set their own minimum GPAs based on the program needs.
