Graduate counseling certificate programs are designed for individuals who have a master's degree in Counseling from a CACREP-accredited institution (or equivalent) and are interested in acquiring additional knowledge and skills, and potentially the necessary credentials, to work in other settings. We offer certificate programs in:

- Clinical Mental Health Counseling
- School Counseling

A total of 9 to 21 credits, including a one- or two-semester internship, will be required for each certificate program, depending on the background of the individual and the intended emphasis.

If you are pursuing a certification or licensure, you are advised to talk directly with personnel in those State of Wisconsin agencies (Department of Safety and Professional Services or Department of Public Instruction) regarding your specific requirements.

Please note that these certificate programs are NOT accredited by CACREP and financial aid is NOT available for certificate programs at this time.



To apply, you need to first complete a School of Graduate Studies application; this form is found on their website at http://www.uww.edu/gradstudies/futurestudent.

Applications for the certificate programs are accepted on a rolling basis. Admission decisions are made by consensus of the faculty. If admitted, a faculty advisor will be assigned and will work with you to determine a Program of Study (POS). Certificate programs must be completed within a seven-year time frame.
