**The Master of Social Work (MSW)** program is a professional education training program that is designed to meet the needs of our society through the preparation of professionally educated social work practitioners. University of Wisconsin-Whitewater’s MSW program accepts traditional (for non-social work majors) and advanced standing (for social work majors) who want to advance their careers in social work.

Any student who successfully completes the MSW program will be considered to have graduated from a Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) accredited program which will enable them to apply for social work licensure.

MSW students receive professional hands-on experience. Field experience offers students the opportunity to test and demonstrate their knowledge, value, and skill in a supervised educational setting. Students are placed in a variety of agencies, commensurate with their expressed interest and educational needs.
