The exhibit will be open for viewing on Tuesday, November 19, 2019 from 10 am-8 pm and during regular Gallery hours Monday-Thursday of that week.



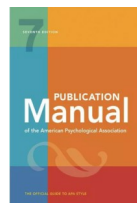

APA Style 7.0

The American Psychological Association has rolled out the Seventh edition of its [Publication manual of the American Psychological Association: The official guide to APA style](#).

If you would like to get familiar with the 7th Ed. now, the Library has [several copies](#) to help you get up to speed.

Here are a few of the changes: publisher locations are eliminated, DOIs become URLs, the first 20 authors of a source are used in the reference list, and ebook formats (e.g., Nook) are no longer used.
