

QTT GRANTS PROGRAM - TREASURY ARPA \$9.12 MILLION

The Qualified Treatment Trainee (QTT) grants program is funded by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, Division of Care and Treatment Services with authority under Wis. Stat. § 146.618 and Treasury American Rescue Plan Act.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Qualified Treatment Trainee (QTT) Grants Program is intended to increase the number of high-quality post-graduate QTT positions available across Wisconsin. A QTT is a post-graduate level clinician completing supervised training hours to achieve advanced clinical licensure.

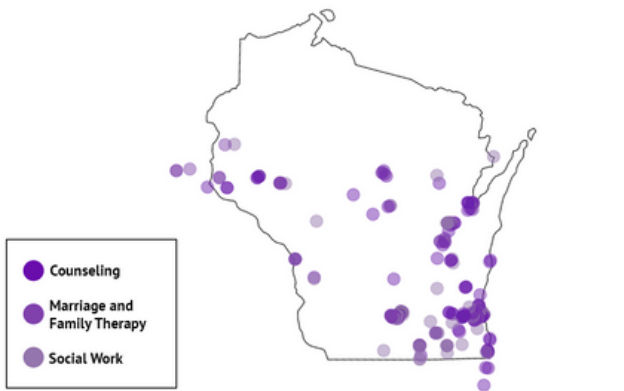
The goal is to support the clinical skills of QTTs and supervisory skills through supervisory development training while working within an agency that embraces the additional responsibilities and best practices in supervision. The QTT Grants Program also includes professional development opportunities designed to facilitate QTT supervisors to review, refresh, and improve their supervisory professional development, regardless of their prior experience.

HUMAN SERVICES ACCELERATED PATHWAY TO MSW DEGREE

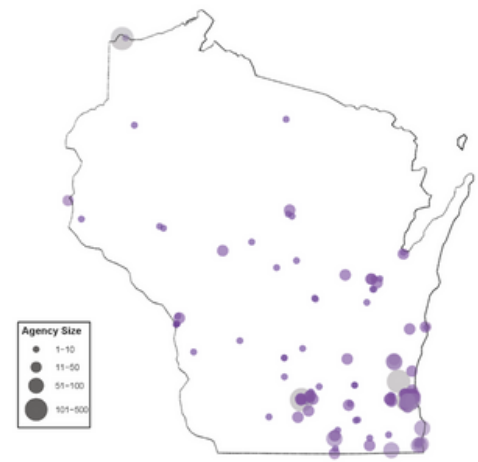
The Online Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences (BAAS) - with a Human Services emphasis was specifically designed to offer a flexible degree completion pathway for students who hold an applied associates degree from a technical college for a seamless transition into a Master of Social Work Program.
